



Community Larder Donations...

Acorn Class		<p>The children have continued exploring 'The Magic Porridge Pot' thinking about the adjectives and verbs within the story and coming up with their own adjectives and verbs.</p> <p>Reception have carried on with their sound writing and have been looking at hearing the initial sounds in the words.</p>	<p>Year 1 have been exploring teen numbers this week, splitting numbers into tens and ones.</p> <p>Reception have continued their number work this week. We have been exploring greater than and less than and ordering numbers.</p>
Beech Class		<p>The children have begun to learn their T4W text 'The Papaya that Spoke' and identified the different nouns in the story.</p> <p>In SPaG the children have been using rhyming words used by Centipede in <i>James & the Giant Peach</i>.</p>	<p>The children have continued with their work on place value. Year 2 have been recording 2 digit number with towers of tens, ones as well as pictorially. Year 3 have made 3-digit numbers using specific criteria.</p>
Oak Class		<p>The children have learnt and recited their class text – using iMovie to edit it all together.</p> <p>In our grammar work we have looked at the possessive apostrophe.</p>	<p>We have been ordering numbers using $<$, $>$ and $=$ as well as finding missing digits that create correct number sentences.</p> <p>e.g. $5\square46 < \square246$</p>
