<p style="text-align: center;">Sporting Achievements to Date: 2018 – 2019</p> <p style="text-align: center;">We are delighted that once again we have achieved the School Games Gold Award !</p> <p>This year, Llangrove CE Academy did very well in the HMFA Federation Sports League. This was another significant achievement for Llangrove Academy as we were top of the small schools in the Federation.</p> <p>Every child in Key Stage 2 participated in at least one event in the following Sports; Track Athletics– held at Hereford Leisure Centre – 3rd Tag Rugby tournament – held at Marden Primary – 1st – champions! Rounders tournament – held at Sutton Academy. – 1st – champions! Netball tournament – held at Scudamore Academy – 3rd</p> <p>Being a small school with only 40 pupils in Key Stage 2, this was a great achievement.</p> <p>Our teams participated in a number of School Games competitions, organised by the Herefordshire School Games Team. Participating in netball, rounders and athletics as well as attending a swimming gala, there were opportunities to get to know other children and establish links with other schools in the vicinity of Ross-on-Wye.</p> <p>Our biggest achievement this year was when the rounders team qualified to play rounders at the Herefordshire Summer School Games event in Hereford. Along with nearly 2,000 other children, the children participated in a day of rounders, winning two their games! The day also involved trying other sports in the “Sports Village” including, cheerleading, Kung Fu, rowing, volleyball and much more. Once again our children in Years 4, 5 and 6 had six weeks of coaching by a representative from Worcester Warriors. This culminated with a mini- intra-school tournament. Year 2 and 3 children received coaching sessions from Chris Friend from Ross-on-Wye Tennis Club.

The highlight of our year was when a former Olympic and National coach Bernie Moss, from Hereford Pentathlon visited. He introduced Oak class to some of the five disciplines of fencing, swimming, horse riding, running and shooting.

This year swimming sessions were extended to one hour for all children in the school, as a result we have seen significant improvement in water confidence and ability across both Key Stages & in EYFS. For Key Stage 2, the sessions culminated in a very exciting House Tournament.

EYFS and Key Stage 1 children attended the HMFA Federation multi-skills event at Hereford Leisure Centre. The children participated in a range of activities, designed to improve basic movement and fundamental sport skills in a fun, challenging and enjoyable environment.

Dance continues to make an impact at Llangrove Academy. Children planned and performed a Scottish themed Dance at the annual Moving Targets event at the Courtyard Theatre in Hereford. The children entertained a huge audience with their interpretation of “Touch the Sky”. Families enjoyed their impeccably timed performance and it was an opportunity to further develop their dance and performance skills. Beech class performed “A million Dreams” dance to Acorn class (Rec & Year 1) and afterwards gave them a “Masterclass” to develop their mirroring dance skills.

On a Tuesday and Thursday every child is encouraged to do as “much as they can” in ten minutes by walking/ jogging/sprinting around the school perimeter. Children are set “Personal Challenges” and are encouraged to challenge themselves to beat their score/time at various skills. Team points are awarded to keep participation and engagement.
