

#### Acorn Class




We have been learning the story of 'The Enormous Turnip' using our talk for writing actions. We have explored and used story telling phrases and had a go at adding a new character into the story using adjectives to describe. We are now moving on to innovating the story to make it our own.

Year 1 have been exploring place value looking at our numbers to 100. We have been practicing counting in 10's, finding ten more and ten less, comparing numbers and adding in tens using basic number facts to help our addition.

Reception have continued their exploration of numbers to 20. We have explored our number bonds to 5 and used practical resources to support addition and subtraction.

#### Beech Class



Our poetry focus has culminated in us writing descriptive verse about erupting volcanoes, using adjectives, subject linked nouns and powerful verbs. Year 3s have also included adverbs.

We have started our new T4W tale which is called 'Nail Soup'.

We tasted some yummy vegetable soup in DT too ☺

Year 2 have been exploring place value of 2 digit numbers; comparing numbers using <, > and =. We have reinforced our understanding using base 10:

$$\begin{array}{|c|c|c|} \hline 1 & 1 & 1 \\ \hline \end{array} = 23$$

Year 3 have been focusing on 3 digit numbers, including recording numbers in different ways - pictorially, in words and expanded e.g.  $352 = 300 + 50 + 2$  the children have then used their understanding to solve word problems.

#### Oak Class



We have written detailed instructions for 'How to Mummify a Body'.

We have focused on using imperative verbs as well as subordinate clauses to give as much detail as possible to the would-be embalmers!

We have revisited work on Place Value so far this half-term: looking at how numbers can be represented, partitioned and written.

## Oak Class

As part of our Science topic 'Life cycles', we have looked at differences between the life cycles of mammals and birds. We acted out the respective stages!
