	Class Story	English & SPaG	Maths
Acorn Class	Route on the Broom	The children have continued their work on the story 'The Magic Porridge Pot'. We have been focusing on our sentence writing, adjectives to describe and our letter formation. The children have had great fun acting out parts of the story in drama and then had a go at innovating them. We cant wait to write our own version of the story next week.	In maths we have continued our work on place value. Year 1 have been practising counting forwards and backwards, one more and one less and looking at partitioning numbers into parts. Reception have been exploring how we represent our numbers to 5, counting forwards and backwards and accurately counting objects.
Beech Class	DAHL	The children have been thinking about the characters in the story. We have used adjectives to descibe them and, in preparation for our story writing, described a range of fruits. We have read different poems in T4Reading and have each chosen a poem to learn and practise at home.	The children have been counting from 0 and investigating the repeated patterns in the 'ones' in Y2: 2, 5 and 10 e.g. the 'ones' when counting in 2s is 0,2,4,6,8 Y3: 3, 4 and 8 The children have begun to use their place value knowledge to add and subtract, using a range of methods to check their answers
Oak Class	THE LOSS GODS	We have written an adapted version of Thog's Journey – focusing on incorporating our target vocabaulary. We have then devised a variety of possible plots for creating a new 'Journey Tale' and have decided upon Sir Cumference and his noble stead Radius making their way up to Scotland to retrieve a stolen key.	Y4 &5 have continued to focus upon how numbers can be represented, including ordering numbers and counting through zero. Y6 – We have practised adding and subtracting numbers through zero; including in the context of temperature, money and sea depth.

Many thanks if you have already ordered online and returned your child's design back to school ready for the next stage of the ordering process.


A reminder that the deadline for ordering is **Tuesday 12th October**.





