


Dear Lord,

	Class Story	English & SPaG	Maths
Acorn Class		In English we have been looking at poetry. We have had a go learning and performing a poem, exploring rhyming and adjectives and had a go at using our senses to describe. We have had great fun writing our own similes to go into our own class poem. Reception have had great fun using adjectives to describe the fireworks and thing of onomatopoeia words to describe the sounds of the fireworks.	Year 1 have been exploring the composition of numbers 6-10. We have been using the tens frame to represent the numbers, compare using greater than, less than and equal to and sorting odd and even numbers. Reception have been exploring partitioning the number 5 using their rekenreks.
Beech Class		The children have started their non-fiction unit about Instructions this week. They have seen video footage of an alien invasion that happened on the school field on Thursday evening. The children are hoping to write some instructions that will allow us to catch our very own alien!	In Maths, we have been thinking about how to subtract multiples of 10 and multiples of 100 from a number. We have used place value counters and base 10 to support our working out.
Oak Class		We have planned and started writing our own Journey Tale. I am very much looking forward to reading them upon completion! In our grammar session we focused on adding information to a subject through the use of relative clauses. E.g. John played guitar daily. > John, who loved the music of the Beatles, played guitar daily.	Y4&5 – Introduction to the formal methods of addition Y6 – Looking at how we can use compensation to aid mental addition. E.g. $14.89 + 3.65 = 15 + 3.65 - 0.11$

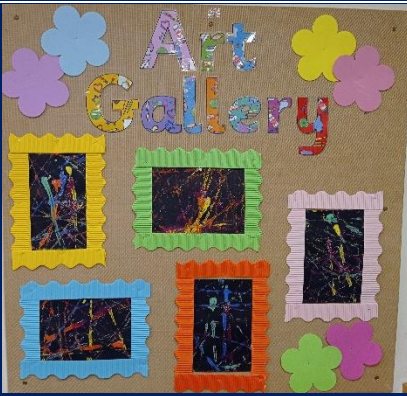
