	Class Story	English & SPaG	Maths
Acorn Class		<p>Year 1 have been writing their own non-chronological report all about Bog Babies. We have created a research map first and are now writing our report, checking our use of: capital letters, full stops, conjunctions and sub-headings.</p> <p>Reception have been focusing on what a sentence looks like, using capital letters and full stops.</p>	<p>In maths, we have been exploring the number 10. We have looked at the different representations of the number 10 and explored our number bonds to 10 using rekenreks, tens frames, numicon and our fingers!</p> <p>We have also moved on to explore our 2D shapes, naming them and describing their properties.</p>
Beech Class		<p>The children have been thinking about the dragon character in the story 'The Paperbag Princess', creating a bank of nouns, adjectives, verbs and adverbs that we have used to describe him.</p> <p>In non-fiction, we have used imperative verbs to give verbal instructions.</p>	<p>In our addition work, we have been identifying the importance of knowing the number bonds to ten to support adding</p> <p>Y2: multiples of 10 Y3: multiples of 100 e.g. $3 + 7 = 10$; $30 + 70 = 100$; $300 + 700 = 1000$</p>
Oak Class		<p>The children investigated the structure of an acceptance speech by watching previous Oscar winners' speeches and comparing them. We then used these features to plan and write our own acceptance speech – ensuring it related to us.</p> <p>These were then read aloud in front of a live audience at yesterday's Oscars.</p>	<p>Y4/5 – Using our knowledge of addition and subtraction to calculate perimeter.</p> <p>Y6 – Have been analysing subtraction number sentences. We have learnt several different mental as well as written methods to aid in the efficient calculation of the answer. e.g. $50,000 - 5,246 = 49,999 - 5,245$, therefore is easier to calculate using the formal written method.</p>

Acorn Class is, as always, full of colour and creativity, including Impressionist art inspired by Monet and *Bog Babies* in different blues.



Beech Class have been testing their predictions about the rigidity of different rulers in science this week, ensuring that the investigation was a fair test. We were amazed how much our translucent plastic rulers bend with 300g on them ☺

TRAFFIC REGULATION ORDER SCHEME: PROPOSED 20MPH SPEED LIMIT FOR LLANGROVE VILLAGE


Yesterday we received a letter, written on behalf of Herefordshire Council and Balfour Beatty, to advise us of a proposal to implement a reduction in the existing 30mph speed limit to a 20mph speed limit on the adopted roads within the village of Llangrove.

The measures have been proposed for the following reasons:

1. For avoiding danger to persons or other traffic using the road or any other road or for preventing the likelihood of any such danger arising
2. For the preservation and improvement of the amenity of the area concerned
3. To improve safety for local residents living in the village
4. To improve safety for vulnerable road users such as school children attending the local Primary School

Our school, of course, welcome and approve this proposal. I would very much like to include the views of the children and parents in our letter of support. We will be speaking with the children about their views and thoughts on the proposal but also welcome your views too.
