These were then read aloud in front of a live audience at yesterday's Oscars.	<ul> <li>Y4/5 – Using our knowledge of addition and subtraction to calculate perimeter.</li> <li>Y6 – Have been analysing subtraction number sentences. We have learnt several different mental as well as written methods to aid in the efficient calculation of the answer.</li> <li>e.g. 50,000 – 5,246 = 49,999 – 5,245, therefore is easier to calculate using the formal written method.</li> </ul>

## TRAFFIC REGULATION ORDER SCHEME: **PROPOSED 20MPH SPEED LIMIT FOR LLANGROVE VILLAGE**

Yesterday we received a letter, written on behalf of Herefordshire Council and Balfour Beatty, to advise us of a proposal to implement a reduction in the existing 30mph speed limit to a 20mph speed limit on the adopted roads within the village of Llangrove.

The measures have been proposed for the following reasons:

1. For avoiding danger to persons or other traffic using the road or any other road or for preventing the likelihood of any such danger arising

2. For the preservation and improvement of the amenity of the area concerned

3. To improve safety for local residents living in the village

4. To improve safety for vulnerable road users such as school children attending the local Primary School

Our school, of course, welcome and approve this proposal. I would very much like to include the views of the children and parents in our letter of support. We will be speaking with the children about their views and thoughts on the proposal but also welcome your views too.
