

	Class Story	English & SPaG	Maths				
Acorn Class		<p>In Acorn class we have been focussing on the story of 'The Enormous Turnip'. The children have had great fun innovating the story to make it their own. They did a brilliant job of writing the story using adjectives and conjunctions, capital letters and full stops and beautiful handwriting. In reception we have been exploring the story of 'The very hungry caterpillar'. The children have written some super sentences about what they would do if they were a caterpillar!</p>	<p>Year 1 have been partitioning numbers into tens and ones. We have been representing our partitioning in part whole models and bar models. We have then been using those models to write addition and subtraction number sentences and solve missing number problems.</p> <p>In reception we have been revisiting halving this week. The children have practically explored sharing a quantity equally. We have continued our number work to 20 .</p>				
Beech Class		<p>Our story writing work has continued to be centred around the traditional tale 'Nail Soup'. We have compared the similarities and differences between different versions including an adaption 'Stone Soup' (which links to our Science work). In SPaG the children have been writing dialogue using speech bubbles and inverted commas as well as finding synonyms of the verb to say (having great fun speaking in different ways depending on the verb).</p>	<p>The children have been applying their place value knowledge in order to place numbers on blank number lines and to solve problems. 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Oak Class



We have used our creative writing strategies to 'set the scene' for our adapted class text. We then chose one of the Egyptian Gods to be transported into our story in search of answers, an object or help!

Y4/5: We have moved onto multiplication – using our times table knowledge to help us answer related number sentences . e.g. $5 \times 4 = 20$ so $0.05 \times 4 = 0.02$

Y6: We have focused on finding equivalents between percentages, fractions and decimals. We have then calculated percentages of amounts and used this to find the best deals in several shopping challenges!

Acorn class reception have enjoyed 'Cheerio' counting, matching the right amount of 'Cheerios' to the teen numbers. What a great way to practice our counting and fine motor skills. In year 1 we had great fun creating our own number lines and adding and subtracting 10 using number lines.



Beech Class have been learning about the different beliefs, murtis and practices of Hinduism. This has included learning the story of Rama & Sita, Diwali and creating our own class Puja for a time of prayer and reflection.



Beech Class have discovered that **Rocks Rock!** They have made 'chocolate' rocks to help them learn about the three types of rock – sedimentary, metamorphic and igneous; identified different names of rocks and tested hardness and permeability – developing their skills in planning and carrying out fair tests, making predictions and recording their observations.

Yesterday we joined our science topic and DT cookery skills together and made rock cakes.



The children followed the traveler's recipe for 'Nail Soup', discovering it was delicious! Don't worry parents, we swapped a 'chicken rib or two' for chicken or vegetable stock & only pretended to add a shiny nail ☺. We've also made carrot and coriander soup which the children were keen to make at home too.

Sadly today is George's last day at Llangrove- he will be greatly missed by his peers and staff. We wish him well in his new school

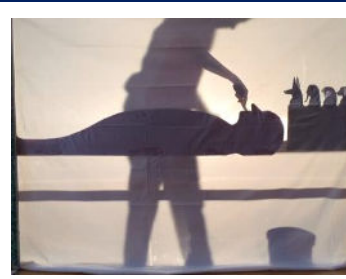
Oak Class
