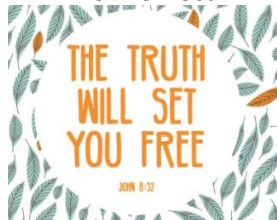

Wow! What a fantastic effort by all.








Gold Awards...

Now that the children are able to return to out-of-school clubs and activities we have reminded the children this week that we'd love to know about and celebrate any achievements or awards in our Friday whole school collective worship – using our Gold Award system.

How the Gold System works:

1. Your child asks their class teacher for a blank 'Gold Award' (it will come home in their book bag/school bag).
2. At home you and your child write on the 'Gold Award' explaining their achievement or award
3. Your child returns the 'Gold Award' (in their bag/book bag) to their class teacher/teaching assistant.
4. Mr. Fox will then read out the awards in the whole school collective worship on Fridays enabling all the children, across the class 'bubbles' to know and celebrate your child's achievement.

Acorn Class		<p>In English we have started exploring our new story 'Shark in the Park'. We have been using talk for writing actions to learn the story, creating our own story maps and using adjectives and sense to describe settings and the characters of in the story.</p> <p>In Reception the children have loved learning the story and had a go at creating their own telescopes and playing a game of I spy using the telescopes writing sentences of what we can see. We have focused on remembering our capital letters and full stops.</p>	<p>In maths we have revisited addition and subtraction this week. The children have been using a number line to count forwards and backwards to work our number sentences. They have been using their knowledge of number bonds to help with their number facts.</p> <p>Reception have continued their place value work, looking at sequencing numbers and exploring vocabulary such as greater than, less than and equal to.</p>
Beech Class		<p>We have been working on our adaptions of 'Nail Soup', which have focused on descriptive language and using inverted commas to punctuate dialogue.</p>	<p>We have been continuing to focus on addition of 2 or 3 numbers - playing 'target number' games and using 100 squares and number lines. The children have been applying number bond facts to 10 to support their work of pairing of numbers to total 100 (Y2) and 3 digit number numbers to total 1000 (Y3)</p>
Oak Class		<p>We have completed our adapted class meeting tale – where our main character encounters an Egyptian God who is in dire need of assistance after the loss of their amulet or ankh.</p> <p>We have now started thinking about the structure of our independent stories which we will begin to write next week.</p>	<p>Y4 & Y5: The children have been introduced to the formal method of multiplication. We have practised as a class and address any misconceptions they may have about the new method. We have had plenty of 'Eureka' moments from the children in class this week!</p> <p>Y6: We have revisited the formal method of long multiplication – finding the factors of 'vampire numbers' (cue evil laugh...). Ask your children to explain what they are ©</p>
