












# Reading Challenge – Summer 2021 What is the Summer Reading Challenge? https://summerreadinachallenge.org.uk/

The Summer Reading Challenge is the UK's biggest free reading for pleasure event for children. It is run by the national charity <a href="The Reading Agency">The Reading Agency</a> in partnership with the UK public library network. The aim of the Challenge is to encourage children to read any six books of their choice from their library during the summer holidays.

The Challenge offers children and families an enjoyable activity in the six-week summer break from school when reading skills and confidence can dip, commonly known as the 'summer slide'. Children receive special rewards each time they finish a book

and there's a certificate for everyone who completes the Challenge.

## Why is reading for pleasure important?

- Currently, 1 in 5 children in England cannot read well by the age of 11. We know that reading for fun improves literacy.
- Reading for pleasure is more important to children's academic success than their parents' level
  of education or socio-economic status.
- Embedding a love of reading in children can help their wellbeing later in life. 19% of adult readers say that reading stops them feeling lonely.
  - Studies have found that those who read for pleasure have higher levels of empathy, greater self-esteem and are better able to cope with difficult situations.
