On Tuesday Acorn class had a very exciting trip to Pizza Express as part of our topic 'Me and my world'. We started our morning by making sure our hands were washed and aprons were on. Carrying on the jubilee theme – the children have been learning how to write informal letters – writing a 'recount' about the jubilee events.	The children have been focusing on making amounts of money – with the fewest number of coins.  They have been developing their clock reading skills too – including using the x5 to help learn the time to the nearest 5 mins. Year 3 have started to read the time in the 24 hour clock
