

Summer Holidays...

Parents often ask us about how they can help their child at home over the summer holidays.

Listed below are some suggestions of how you can help and support your child



Reading

Encourage your child to **take advantage of every opportunity to read** - comics or magazines; information leaflets about places you have visited or are planning to visit; instructions for games, making things,

baking; road signs; information boards; maps...

- Visit the local library and take part in the Summer Reading Challenge
 Each year the Summer Reading
 Challenge has a different theme. For 2022, The Reading Agency is partnering with the Science Museum
 Group for Gadgeteers, a science and innovation themed Challenge that will spark children's curiosity about the world around them.
- Read picture books (ask your child questions about what they've learnt, how they think the character is feeling



how they think the character is feeling, what they think will happen next...) and information books (discuss the what your child has learnt and the features e.g. contents, index, glossary).



Developing & perfecting motor skills and basic skills

Arts and craft activities are a perfect way for your child to develop their scissor, drawing and painting skills – including cutting along a given line; cutting around shapes and drawings; using a ruler to draw a line or measure; colouring using pens and pencils – trying to keep in the shape or drawing lines and of course developing creativity.

Looking at art galleries in places you visit whilst on holiday are also a great way for your child to develop their art and design skills and understanding

Develop 'everyday' math skills

There are lots of ways in which you can bring maths to life for your child through simple activities. Whether out shopping or on holiday, using the context of money to help develop your child's skills – e.g. encourage them to work out what coins they need to buy an ice-cream or how much change they will get back. Making smoothies, squash or baking are great ways to help your child read millilitres, litres, grams and kilogram scales. Arts, crafts and even DIY are a great way to practise measuring in milimetres, centimetres and metres.



Learning Timestables



The curriculum for Maths states that all times tables and associated division facts must be known (up to 10x10) by the end of Year 4. It will therefore benefit your child to continue to learn and practice their times tables over the summer holidays – beginning with the **x2**, **x5** and **x10** (Y1 & 2) followed by **x3**, **x4**, **x6 & x8** and then **x7** and **x9** (Y3 & Y4).

Play board & card games

Board and card games can be great for developing a child's math and problem solving skills too! Games like scrabble are a great way to develop word knowledge and spelling. Perhaps teach your child a new game like chess, dominoes...



🗫 Developing knowledge of places in the local environment, the UK, Europe and the World.

Wherever you visit or go on holiday this summer, locally, in the UK or further afield, encourage your child to find its location on a map or atlas.

Talk about the places you may pass on the journey, the villages, towns, cities, countries, countries, the main geographical features – rivers, mountains, seas...
