Acorn Class



Acorn Class have jetted off to Africa and are off on Safari! We have had great fun exploring our safari themed activities in the classroom!

In Design Technology the children have used levers, linkages and pivots to make moving dinosaurs.

In gymnastics, Beech class have been having a go at devising short sequences with a partner. They have exploring mirroring and counter balancing, worked on tension and incorporating different levels into their routines. They performed their routines to the class with confidence! For the next few weeks, they will be exploring and adapting their routines onto apparatus.



As part of their introduction to their new topic 'Changes – Stone Age to Iron Age' the children opened their fossils created from bread and sweets! We discussed how the sweets had already started to change and how, if we were to leave them for a longer period of time, they would decay like a body in the fossilisation process. We used the top tips from the famous palaeontologist Mary Anning and were patient and took it one chip at a time to reveal the impressions made.



Acorn Class		We have been exploring the features of a recount. We have been using time conjunctions, past tense verbs and adjectives to write our very own recounts about. We have been revisiting sentence structure remembering our capital letters, full stops, finger spaces and checking out sentences make sense.	We have been exploring measure, looking at length. We have compared different lengths using shorter and longer, measured different objects using cubes and had a go at measuring using a ruler. We have continued with our mastering of number too focussing in on our recall of our number bonds to 10.
Beech Class		The children have written their own versions of 'Tyrannosaurus Drip' as well as completed information work on dinosaurs. They are now getting to know our new Talk4Writing texts: Elf Road – a Portal Tale Why Are Dragons Extinct? – an explanation text	The children have completed their work on multiplication and division. They continue to learn and practise their recall of facts for x2, x5, x10 and x4. Year 2 have been using the terms sides, vertices and polygons to help us recognise, name and describe 2D shapes. Year 3s have learnt the terms parallel and perpendicular when looking at 2D shapes as well as learning how to identify angles that are smaller than, equal to or bigger than a right angle (90°).
Oak Class		The children have written their final drafts of their own portal tale - taking feedback from their peers to help edit their initial draft. Stories have been uploaded onto Seesaw for you to read. We hope you enjoy them.	Y4 & 5: Looking at how decimals are used to represent money and rounding decimals to a given place value. Y6: We have been using our knowledge of equivalent fractions and simplifying fractions to add and subtract related fractions.

They survive with water

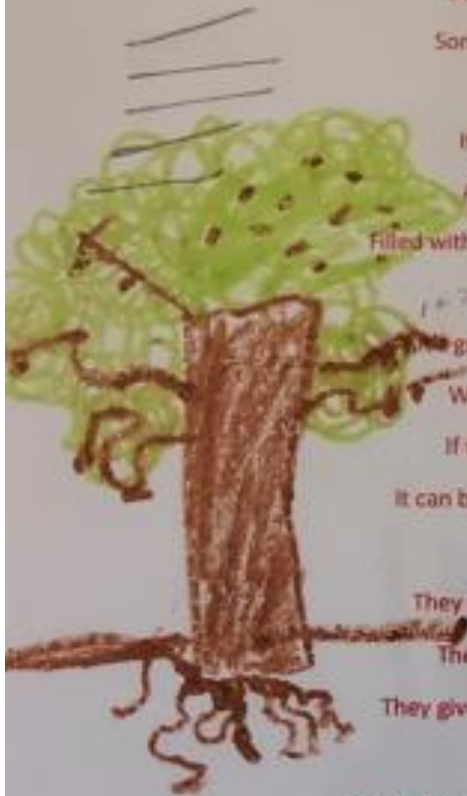
They die with none

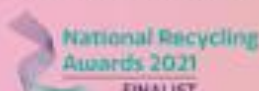
