Acorn Class	SUPERATO FUE	The children have had an exciting week exploring our new text for the half term- 'Supertato' by . We couldn't believe it when we found the library in a mess at the start of the week, so we did some investigating and created 'wanted' posters to catch the person who made the mess! This week we have also used actions to learn the text of 'Supertato' and created our own story maps of the story.	We have been focussing on place value, addition, and subtraction. We have continued our work on counting forwards and backwards to 100 starting from different numbers. We have been using practical resources to support our addition and subtraction work, writing the number sentences to match our pictures.



In Acorn Class we have launched our new topic of 'Superheroes'. We enjoyed talking about our favourite superheroes, discussing what superpowers we would like to have and had fun playing superheroes in the role play area. We even made our own superhero badges which look amazing!

Curricular Theme: 'Where the Wild Things Are' – Islands, Seas & Volcanoes



The children have been focusing on building a bank of nouns & adjectives to describe seas and islands. These will be used in their forthcoming story writing 'journey tales' and poetry. Our spelling has been focusing on Y1/2/3&4 common exception words as well as spelling days of the week and months of the year. Our maths sessions this week have focussed on equal and unequal grouping to support our understanding of multiplication & division. We have also been focsuing on time facts Y2: consolidating the language relating to dates, days, weeks, months and years, inclduing The order of days, months & seasons Y3: The order of months and learning the number of days in each month, year and Leap year.

Beech Class

In our new topic 'Where the Wild Things Are' the children were introduced to the geographical terms 'physical' and 'human' features. They then designed an 'initial letter' island which included some of the geographical features were had discussed.
