Forest Schools...

### Forest Schools will start for Acorn Class on Wednesday 1st March,

led by our Forest School Lead, Mrs Howie.

On Forest School days:

- The children wear their Forest Schools clothes to & from school.
- Wellington/outdoor boots (named/labelled) should be in a bag to change into prior to the session.
- Sessions are very 'hands on' and the children can get muddy so the children's clothes shouldn't be their best.

#### Clothes needed for Forest School:

- Warm, water proof jacket/coat
- warm trousers waterproof trousers (if possible)
- jumper / sweatshirt
- long sleeved top
- warm socks for wearing with wellies plus spare socks (in case feet get wet)
- scarf, hat and gloves
