	Class Story	English & SPaG	Maths
Acorn Class		We have been exploring the story of 'The Magic Bed'. We have explored the story, looking at the characters and setting of the story. We have spotted the nouns in the story and explored how to make words plural, learning the rules. Acorn Class have also had great fun innovating the story, creating new journeys and new magic items to travel on!	Year 1 have been focussing on exploring place value of 2-digit numbers. We've been partitioning our 2-digit numbers into tens and ones and creating addition and subtraction number sentences using our knowledge of place value. They are doing brilliantly with their counting in 10's, 2's and 5's and using that knowledge to support their mathematical thinking and problem solving.

Reception have had great fun creating their own transport books, focussing on their super sentence writing and great phonics. They look fantastic! Reception have continued to focus on their partitioning of numbers. They have started with numbers 6-10 partitioning them into 5 and a bit. We have then moved on to looking at our teen numbers 11-19 partitioning them into 10 and a bit.

Acorn class have enjoyed our new topic of 'We're going on a journey'. We went on a journey around the village and explored what we could find in our local area. We then created a map of our local area!

Our SPaG work has focused on prepositions as well as applying our weekly spellings into our writing. Our fictional writing has been linked to our class story Flat Stanley. Non-fictional writing is focusing on bibliographies, including learning about our new king! Addition lessons have seen the children using partitioning to add tens and ones, supported by resources, as well as using the formal column addition method.

The children's multiplication work has focused on x4 facts, as well as consolidating x2, x5 and x10.





Following on from our investigation about transparent, translucent and opaque materials, the children have investigated how shadows are made; how the position of a light source effects the size and length of a shadow – before making the link to the position of the sun in our Forest School session.



Inspired by the nesting sparrows and jackdaw on & in the school building the children also made some lovely nests









We have created a shared text that tells the story of a young girl in the village who visits a haunted house and encounters an unknown being. We are now devising our own suspense tale where a main character will visit a mysterious location.

We have been identifying and manipulating fractions. Adding, subtracting, multiplying and dividing them. We are now looking at the relationship between fractions, decimals and percentages.

On Friday 28th April Year 4 spent the afternoon at a Living History event on Monmouth Showground, organised by The Sealed Knot. As an educational charity the Sealed Knot are dedicated to improving awareness and knowledge about the turbulent period, in the mid-17th century, of the Wars of the Three Kingdoms or the English Civil Wars. They do this through re-enactments of the military episodes but also through lectures, displays and Living History encampments where people can see, and talk to, experts in the daily life of the period and in crafts and other activities. For the first time as a society, they opened their living history camp especially for schools, so that our Year 4 pupils, and many others, had the chance to interact with re-enactors and see the clothing, weapons, domestic equipment and other elements of life in that period.





As part of the celebrations to mark 150 years of <u>Monmouth</u> RFC, local schools were invited to create a painting depicting 150 years of rugby in Monmouth in an imaginative way.

Pupils in years 4, 5 and 6 from a number of primary schools produced some "wonderful" pictures which were displayed in the Shire Hall, Monmouth alongside some fascinating pictures of the town over the years. Rugby Club President Byron Hapgood and Richard Wills, renowned local artist and former first-class rugby player, had been invited to view the pictures and select some to be framed. They had over 150 paintings entered in total.

Eight paintings were eventually chosen for framing and it was wonderful and a credit to **Chelsea**, **Finlay**, **Sophia & Stanley** that their artwork was chosen. On the 21st April they were handed back their framed artwork plus a bonus of some pin badges and chocolates.

David Price thanked the teachers and parents for encouraging the children to enter "and especially the children who came up with great ideas related to rugby, Monmouth, 150 years and a celebration. "There is a lot of quality in the paintings we had," he said, "it wasn't judged on a first second and third basis, it was about an individual's view of what they see; it was a difficult task for them".
