
Welcome to the first newsletter of the autumn term and new school year at Llangrove CE Academy. We look forward to working with you and your children throughout the academic year.

Acorn Class	Curricular Theme: 'It's a kind of magic!'		
		<p>We have started to explore our new text of 'Room on the Broom'. We have used actions to learn the story, created our own story maps and even designed a new broomstick for the witch! Year 1 have been focusing on writing super sentences remembering their capital letters, finger spaces and full stops. Reception have enjoyed looking at what is in the witches back pack sorting the pictures into whether they start with the 's' sound or the 'a' sound.</p>	<p>Year 1 have been focusing on their counting skills. We have been accurately counting a quantity of objects and writing the numeral to match. We have been comparing groups of objects using greater than, less than and equal to.</p> <p>Reception have started to develop their number sense by exploring numbers 1, 2 and 3. We have looked at different ways those numbers can be represented and sorted pictures into whether they show 1, 2 and 3. Reception have also worked hard to develop their subitising skills.</p>
	<p>Acorn Class have been launched into our topic of. We enjoyed making our very own magic wands to start our topic- they look very sparkly!</p> <div></div>		
Beech Class	Curricular Theme: Changes: Stone Age to Iron Age		
		<p>The children have written 'cold task' descriptions of a character – inspired by 'I'll Take You to Mrs Cole!' story. They have also written a information text.</p> <p>In SPaG we have been focusing on alphabetic order of letters and words.</p> <p>Y2: Using 1<sup>st</sup> &amp; 2<sup>nd</sup> letters</p> <p>Y3: Using 3<sup>rd</sup> or 4<sup>th</sup> letters.</p>	<p>Y2 children have been focusing on counting on and back to 100.</p> <p>Y3s have been focusing on place value, Tens and Ones to 100.</p> <p>They have worked on counting in fives – including using tally in science.</p>
	<p>The children became archeologists during their introduction to the new topic. They discovered stone age animals and early man inside 'clay' pebbles. The children also looked at the 'fossil' like imprints left in the hardened clay.</p> <div></div>		




Curricular Theme: Rivers and Mountains		
Maple Class	 <p>The children have been writing free verse river poems. We took inspiration from "The River" by Valerie Bloom.</p>	<p>We have been using column addition and column subtraction to work out the sum and difference of different values. We have then taken our learning and applied it to working with money.</p>
<p>The children have been finding out about our topic, rivers and mountains. They have painted Claude Monet inspired artwork, using his style to find their own. They worked with creating reflections in the water and were very successful.</p>

### Daily Mile...

All the children (& staff) take part in a morning 'Daily Mile' which involves walking, jogging or running (at their own pace) around the school playground, or weather permitting.



### School Lunches...

- The cut off time for ordering lunches is midnight on the Wednesday, the week before they are due.
- All school lunches must be ordered online via Parent Pay even if your child is eligible for a free school meal.
- A reminder that lunches can be ordered for a number of weeks in advance.

### Breaktime Snacks & Milk...

To promote a healthy lifestyle we encourage the children to have a healthy snack at break time (10.45am) each day. A healthy snack will help to keep hunger pangs at bay till lunchtime and aid concentration in class!



**Pupils in Reception, Year 1 & Year 2 are provided with daily fruit or vegetables.**

What do we mean by a healthy break time snack?

- Any fresh fruit e.g. apple, grapes, strawberries, tomatoes
- Natural dried fruit e.g. raisins, sultanas, bananas
- Any raw or cooked vegetable e.g. celery or carrot
- Plain bread e.g. breadsticks, soda bread, cracker



Pupils in Reception who are 4 years old are entitled to free daily milk.

Milk is available for 5 years + pupils if parents/carers wish to order

Please contact Miss Marchetto, if your child would like daily milk, but is not currently registered with Cool Milk.

**Forest School takes place no matter what the weather** (unless it is really windy) so please send your child with their wellington boots & waterproofs every session.

These sessions, led by Mrs Howie, are very 'hands on' and the children can get muddy so the children's clothes shouldn't be their best.

#### On Forest School days:

- The children wear their **Forest Schools clothes and outdoor shoes/trainers** to school.
- Have their **waterproofs & wellies (labelled)** in a bag or rucksack to put on prior to the afternoon session.

**\*Maple Class** – please note that when Maple Class have Forest schools this term they will have their PE lesson in the morning. Maple Class pupils should therefore wear their PE kit to school and bring their Forest School clothes in a bag so they can change ready for the afternoon session.



#### Clothes needed for Forest School:

**Please use old clothes and let your child know that they CAN GET DIRTY!**

- Warm, water proof jacket/coat
- Warm trousers
- Waterproof trousers (if possible)
- jumper / sweatshirt
- long sleeved top
- warm long socks plus spare warm socks
- wellington boots or sturdy waterproof outdoor boots
- scarf, hat and gloves for cold, wet days



## It's GOOD TO BE GREEN!

### Our Positive Behaviour System Explained...

#### 'Green Card'

- Every child in the school aims to be 'Good to be Green' all week, following the school and their class rules and behave appropriately at all times.
- Good behaviour and attitude to learning is praised by staff throughout the day & every week.



#### 'Yellow card'

- Occasionally a child may need a reminder of behaviour expectations and rules in school and class.
- If a child needs reminding twice during a session they will be given a verbal 'yellow card'.
- The child will then have 'time out' the time depending on the age of the child.



#### 'Red Card'

- If a child continues not to follow the code, the child will be asked to reflect on their behaviour choices, firstly with their teacher and then with Mrs Dean or Mr Fox.
- Parents/carers will be informed either in person or by telephone at the end of the school day to discuss with the class teacher why a red card was given, so that we can continue to work together to ensure all of our children are able to achieve their full potential in a positive learning environment.



At the end of the week children receive a 'Froggy stamp' for staying 'green' all week (recorded on a chart). Froggy Stamps are also be given during the week as praise for behaviour, attitude and manners ~ linked to our ACORN values. There are 5 levels on the chart – Green, Bronze, Silver, Gold & Platinum . Prizes are given to children upon completion of each level, prizes are chosen in collaboration with the School Council.

#### **Celebrations of Behaviour, learning & special achievements ...**

- **Class worker** - mascot or sticker given by teacher/teaching assistants
- **Weekly Class Superstar Award**–linked to our ACORN Values. Certificate given and name recorded on newsletter.



- **PE Superstars** – chosen by class teacher each PE lesson, names are displayed on the PE noticeboard, as well as the newsletter
- **Class Mascot** – voted for by class pupils at the end of each week. Child takes home the mascot and their name is placed on weekly newsletter.
- **Team of the Week** – '**Malley, Wye, Garron & Monnow**' team points given to individuals during the week (which are recorded on class displays) are collated at the end of each week. Results are displayed in the school hall.



- **'Top table' award** –chosen by lunchtime supervisors for good manners and behaviour –Squash and a table cloth given on Friday as a reward. A record is also displayed in the school hall.



- **Gold Award** – these celebrate the children's achievements out of school. The children ask for a gold award certificate from their class teacher. This is taken home and details completed by parent/carers

























- **Ladder Club Legends** – this celebrates the children's success in adding, repeated addition, multiplication & division. Their success in this is further supported by the online resource 'TT Rockstars' in which the children challenge themselves to develop their 'Rock Star' status.

























- **Super Signer** – this celebrates the children success in using British Sign Language finger spelling & signing
