Acorn Class	Curricular Theme: 'It's a kind of magic!'		
		<p><b>Year 1</b> have been learning a poem called 'autumn days'. We enjoyed putting actions to the poem and performing it to our peers, exploring the key features of the poem and we have now started to innovate the poem so we can add our own new verse. We took inspiration from our autumn walk to help us get creative!</p> <p><b>Reception</b> have been exploring the story 'Don't hog the hedge'. We've enjoyed retelling the story in the small world tray and have used our super phonics skills to sound out and write who we could see in the hedge!</p>	<p><b>Year 1</b> have been exploring composition of numbers to 10. We have been using our knowledge of partitioning to partition numbers and then write the number sentences to match using a + and = to show the sum of the two parts. We have also been exploring odd and even numbers.</p> <p><b>Reception</b> have been focussing on numbers 1,2,3,4 and 5. We have been looking at the different representations of the numbers, representing the numbers using our hands, rekenreks, cubes and numicon and ordering the numbers. We have even moved on to exploring partitioning with the help of numberblocks!</p>
	<p>Acorn Class have enjoyed exploring the season of autumn in the classroom and around the village!</p>		
			
Beech Class	Curricular Theme: Changes: Stone Age to Iron Age		
		<p>We have been retelling the key events in Cave Baby, focusing on changing verbs into the past tense. We have also been planning our 'Unicorn' information texts.</p>	<p>Our maths work has focused on number facts and how they help us to add multiples of 10, 100 and 1000. We have also been looking at strategies – drawing, written methods and mental strategies for finding doubles of 1, 2 and 3 digit numbers. Our multiplication and division facts have focused on x10.</p>
	<p>Our Forest School sessions have been inspired by our topic. The children have: built shelters; made natural paints; used knotting skills to make Stone Age tools; pretended to be sabre-tooth tigers; 'whittled' hazel sticks/branches (provided by Mrs Haggett) into spears – to 'hunt' a mammoth and had fun in the rain!</p>		
			



### Curricular Theme: Rivers and Mountains


#### Maple Class



Maple Class have been busy writing a journey tale in English. We have written one altogether and also had a go independently. We are excited to write our own independent journey tale next week, with our own characters. As a class, we have looked at comparative and superlative adjectives; these will enhance our writing.

We have been looking at conversions of measurement. We went outside and used the trundle wheels to see how many metres were in 1km. Using our knowledge, we have been converting common measurements in order to solve problems.

As part of our topic, we have been learning about the course of a river. To apply our newly learnt knowledge, we made models and drew pictures of different parts of the course of a river.



### Curricular Theme: At the Front

#### Oak Class




We are writing our own Warning Tale entitled: 'The Junkyard'. The pupils have focused on describing the setting in such a way that the reader is concerned that something bad may occur. In grammar, we have been looking at synonyms and antonyms as well as where colons can be used.

We have been looking at multiplying and dividing by powers of ten. We have then moved on to finding decimal equivalents of numbers. E.g.  $1,200,000 = 1.2$  million. Can they remember the little song we've been using to help us remember  $\frac{1}{4}$ ,  $\frac{1}{5}$ ,  $\frac{1}{8}$ ?




In Science, we have been investigating conductors and their impact on circuits. We have used this knowledge to design and make our own Morse Code machines.




