

The Wild Place – Whole School Trip

The children (& staff) had such a wonderful time on Monday 26th September. The children loved seeing so many different animals (wolves, bears, geladas, meerkats, cheetahs, wolverine, lynxes...) as well as learning about their diets and habits. We also learned about how the percentage of forests in Britian has decreased since the Ice Age, which animals have become extinct in Britain overtime and how some species have been reintroduced.

	Curricular Theme: Once Upon a Time		
Acorn Class	Page	We have been continuing with our story of 'The Gingerbread Man'. Year 1 have been focussing on writing super sentences. They have been using capital letters, finger spaces, full stops and adjectives to change the ending of the story. Reception have been working on their verbal composition of sentences. They have been changing parts of the story and acting them out using small world	Reception have continued to work on their subitising and number recognition skills. We have been using cubes to create number shapes, seeing how many different ways we can create numbers 1-5. Year 1 have been focussing on our numbers 1-10. We have explored the composition of the numbers using tens frames and part whole models.
	characters. Curricular Theme: Invaders & Settlers: Celts and Romans		
Beech Class	RºALD DAHL	We have been continuing with our story of 'The Magic Paintbrush. Year 2 have been focusing on writing sentences using the singular and plural nouns. Year 3 have been writing expanded noun phrases in their sentences using the different adjectives and nouns from the story.	Year 2 have continued their work on number bonds to 10 and counting in 10s. They have also used the symbols < and > to compare 10s (in numerical, pictorial and concrete forms). Year 3 have been focusing on counting in 50s and solving numerical problems using multiples of 50.
	Curricular Theme: Chocolate		
Oak Class	ROALD DAHL CHARLES	Y4 have been using a range of resources to aid in our knowledge of subtraction. Using the formal written method, exchanging hundreds and tens. Y5/6 have been investigating tenths and hundredths and identifying errors in calculations e.g. 0.5 – 0.02 does not equal 0.3	We have been learning a range of strategies to describe a character: how their appearance challenged our preconceptions and comparing and contrasting their appearance to other people e.g. Like the majority of wealthy people, Willy Wonka wore expensive clothing.
