



Acorn Class

We have been looking at a poem about dragons! We put actions to the poem to help us learn it off by heart, we drew poetry maps and performed the poem to our peers. We have been exploring rhyming words. The children have spotted the rhyming words in the poem, finding their own rhyming pairs and substituting the poem to make it their own. Reception have enjoyed exploring rhyming words, finding their own rhyming words and playing a rhyming game.

been using the + sign to join the two addends together and the = sign to show the sum of the two addends. They have been using pictures and number lines to write addition number sentences. We have been using our knowledge of partitioning to find the missing number on addition number sentences. Reception have been using practical resources to create addition number sentences. We have been focussing on our number formation to, using loose parts to create the numbers to 10.

In maths we have been focussing on addition. We have

We have been focusing on non-fiction texts: writing a chronological recount of our trip (using 'recount maps' we drew) as well as looking at the features of chronological reports – in preparation for writing about Celts and Romans.

Our number work has focused on adding and subtracting – using number bonds to support our calculations.

Following our maths lesson with the 'Grammaticus' at Caerleon's Legion Museum we have played roman numeral bingo, played gladiator racing using a roman number spinner as well as reading time on a roman numeral clock. We would love for the children to look where Roman numerals are used in everyday life e.g. clocks. This week we have also been learning how 10 and 100 are related to measuring. We have practised drawing lines to specific lengths and measured to the nearest 1cm. Year 3 have x10 to convert cms into mm.

Oak Class We have looked at the unique selling points of different breakfast cereals and planned imaginative ways to advertise the product. We aimed to use rhetorical questions and colons within our writing and focused on delivering opinions as if they were facts.

Y4 have continued to look at how perimeter is measured and answered a variety of perimeter based reasoning problems

Y5/6 have practised their multiplication vocabulary (factor, multiple, product) and have used the formal method of short multiplication to answer plenty of Mr Fox challenges.

Beech Class' Roman fort & baths visit...

The children & staff of Beech Class had a great time, despite the torrential rain, at the Roman Baths and Legion Museum at Caerleon on Monday 21st November. They first visited the baths where they saw the remains of the 'natatio' – the open-air swimming pool including mosaics and the 'hypocaust' central heating system. In the Legion museum the children explored the exhibits; dressed as Roman Legionary soldiers in barracks before having a lesson with a 'Grammaticus' (a roman teacher) who taught them about I lessons in Maths, writing, religion and geography that the children would have


