Acorn Class

Curricular Theme: 'We're going to the zoo!'



Year 1 we have been innovating our story of 'Dear Zoo'. We enjoyed adapting our story maps to make them our own. We created a toolkit to help us with our writing remembering we need conjunctions, adjectives, capital letters, full stops and time conjunctions to show order. We did a super job and created some fantastic stories. Reception also had great fun innovating the story of 'Dear Zoo'. They verbally retold their new version of the story and used their super sound knowledge to write about their new animals. Well done!

As part of our Children's Mental Health Week theme, 'Hear our Voice' Acorn class had great fun exploring our voices by playing Chinese whispers and making our very own 'telephones' to hear our friends.



Reception have continued to develop their understanding of composition of numbers to 5. We have been representing the numbers in different ways finding the two parts that make the whole number. We have got some super speedy number bonds.

Year 1 have been using their knowledge of basic addition and subtraction facts to support their understanding of adding and subtracting with teen numbers. We have also been exploring measurement. We have been comparing lengths, measuring using non-standard units and in cms.





On Tuesday Acorn Class participated in Internet Safety Day. We read the story of 'Detective Digiduck' exploring how we can stay safe when using the internet. We thought about the trusted adults we have in our lives that would help us if there was something we didn't like the look of online. We created our own posters about how we can stay safe online.

Curricular Theme: Maybe it's because I'm a Londoner



Beech Class

We have written our own versions of a journey tale based on 'The Papaya that Spoke' ~ we've really enjoyed retelling the story with actions especially "As fast as his legs could carry him, he ran and he ran and he ran until..." Our non-fiction work has focused on writing commands

We have used arrays to support our multiplication calculations. Year 3 have progressed to using grid multiplication to solve calculations too.



Our Great Fire of London paintings with silhouettes of London skylines brighten up our class. The children were colour mixing with red & yellow (primary colours) to make orange (secondary colour) they experimented with different amounts of the colours, as well as adding white to create tints.







Our Science focus has been magnets & forces. The children have had great fun investigating and were inspired in their magnet forces dance lessons...











Curricular Theme: Earth and Space.



We have finished writing our fear tales. Our astronauts have been on some big missions and conquered their fears. We have been busy writing character descriptions which have included relative clauses, modal verbs and fronted adverbials. We have started our new writing focus of reports, this week. We had an alien landing in Maple Class! We have used our knowledge of possessive apostrophes to match the belonging to the correct alien.

We have been finding fractions of amounts. We started off by just finding one equal part and have now progressed to finding multiple equal parts.



Curricular Theme: Egypt: Land of the Pharaohs



We have written our final drafts of our persuasive Room 101 pieces of writing. Strong cases were made for banishing slow walkers, 1% battery, chewing loudly and nettles amongst other grievances! We have now turned our attention to instructions, focusing initially on the importance of imperative verbs. We will use our skills to write a detailed set of instructions for mummifying a body!

We have been learning the names and characteristics of various polygons and plotting them on a grid with four quadrants. We have then learnt the difference between translation and reflection and used this to change the location of our polygons.





We have created our own 'mock' papyrus and used this to form the material on which we have drawn our choice of Ancient Egyptian god. We used grids to ensure we maintained correct human proportions.

News & upcoming Events


PTFA had their Annual General Meeting on 29th January and have begun planning events for the year. As this term is so short, there wasn't much time to arrange events but there will be an
